| English | <p>Writing genres: historical narrative, play scripts, letters.</p> <p>SPaG: understand how verbs change, was/were, are/is. Verbs ending in ed/ing, use of colons, apostrophes for omission and possession.</p> <p>Class reading book: Charlotte's Web</p> |
| Mathematics | <p>Reading Roman numerals, number and place value recognising the place value in a 4 digit number. Round numbers to the nearest 10 and 100. Addition and subtraction using both mental and formal columnar written methods, money problems, including giving change. Multiply and dividing by 10s, 100s. Multiplication tables up to 10 x 10, including related division facts (inverse operations).</p> |
| Science | <p>Sound: how sound is made, vibrations, pitch and volume.</p> |
| Computing | <p>Digital Literacy: E-Safety Computer Science: Jam Sandwich Algorithm (coding skills).</p> |
| History | <p>The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. The children will be learning about the Roman army and its powerful emperors including Julius Caesar. We will also be studying the legacy left by the Romans.</p> |
| Geography | <p>Comparing Britain and Italy, using maps, locational knowledge, human and physical geography</p> |
| Art and Design | <p>Not this covered this term</p> |
| Design Technology | <p>Shields and helmets, Roman food, Roman design.</p> |
| Physical Education | <p>We will be learning how to play netball this term; the focus will be on building up strength and agility, concluding with a tournament.</p> |
| PSHE | <p>Class Rules, environmental issues.</p> |
| French | <p>Body parts, days of the week, months of the year, numbers</p> |
| Music | <p>Drumming lessons</p> |
