Subject	Focus
English	<p>Reading: Oxford Reading Tree Phonics Programme: Letters and Sounds. Phase 6: suffixes –ing, -er, -est; add the 's/es' suffix as plural. Class Reading Books: George's Marvellous Medicine and Revolting Recipes by Roald Dahl Writing: recipes and character descriptions SPaG: spell common exception words e.g. because, children, beautiful, everybody, people, close, would. Spell words with contacted forms using apostrophes e.g. don't, you're, they're, won't. Use present and past tense mostly correctly and consistently. Compound sentences using co-ordinating conjunctions e.g. or, and, but. Use complex sentences using subordinate conjunctions e.g. when, if, that, because.</p>
Mathematics	<p>Multiplication and Division: recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including recognising odd and even numbers. Calculate mathematical facts, for multiplication and division, within the times tables and write them using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=) signs. Show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division cannot. Use the inverse relationship between multiplication and division in calculations. Relate multiplication and division to grouping and sharing. Solve problems.</p>
Science	<p>Everyday materials: identify and compare the suitability of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.</p>
Computing	<p>Programming using Logo; stop motion animation; digital photography and presentations</p>
History	<p><i>(Not during this term)</i></p>
Geography	<p><i>(Not during this term)</i></p>
Art and Design	<p>Hand and bubble printing</p>
Design Technology	<p>Food – preparing fruit and vegetables: Examine a range of fruit/vegetables. Provide opportunities to handle, smell and taste fruit and vegetables in order to describe them through talking and drawing. Evaluate existing products. Design, make and evaluate a food product.</p>
Physical Education	<p>Gymnastics - pathways: straight, zig zag and curving. Games – Hockey: dribbling and hitting.</p>
PSHE	<p>Safety around medicines and household products.</p>
Music	<p>Ostinatos, rhythms in 4 metre, songs within class topic.</p>
French	<p>Greetings, name, numbers 1-12</p>
