Subject	Focus
English	<p>Reading: Popular Greek legends, Pegasus the Flying Horse, Perseus and Medusa, Pandora's Box as well as describing the Minotaur, Polyphemus the Cyclops and Cerberus.</p> <p>SPaG: use 'a' or 'an' correctly; begin to use inverted commas to punctuate speech.</p> <p>Writing: diary writing; instructions; myths and legends; character descriptions</p>
Mathematics	<p>Number – fractions - equivalent fractions, comparing and ordering fractions, adding and subtracting fractions and solving problems relating to the above; Measurement of time estimate and read time from an analogue clock including using Roman numerals, record and compare time in terms of seconds in a minute, number of days in a month and in a year and in a leap year.</p>
